Course Description

This program focuses on the improvement of students' communication skills; the course will entirely be taught in Italian. By the end of the semester, students will be expected to be familiar with written and spoken use of intermediate linguistic structures. Students will also deal with most common social and cultural dynamics in Italy. The course is designed to encourage practical communication exchanges and to support student integration in Ferrara.

Learning Objectives

By completing this course, students will:

- understand the main points and key words of daily life topics,
- deal with most common social and cultural dynamics when interacting with native speakers while travelling in Italy;
- write simple texts on familiar topics and describe experiences and events, dreams, hopes and ambitions.

Course Prerequisites

Italian language Beginning II level

Methods of Instruction

During this course the students will be exposed to more complex grammatical structures of Italian, increase their fluency and deepen their knowledge of different cultural aspects of contemporary Italy. In addition to lectures and traditionally structured lessons, the course will feature fieldtrips and walking tours.

Course schedule is subject to change due to study tours, excursions, or local holidays. Final schedules will be included in the final syllabus provided to students on site.

Course Requirements



Homework

Students will have written assignments to check their progress. The topics will be connected to those studied in class.

Oral Presentation

Students will use simple sentences to recap one or more topics studied during the course and present their opinions and thoughts about them. They can use PowerPoint, videos, recordings, etc. At the end of the presentations, students will ask questions and discuss about each oral project.

Final Test

Students will take a final exam at the end of the course. The exam will include all topics analyzed in class.

Participation

Participation means attention and respect. You are expected to arrive to class on time not only to avoid an absence, but also to avoid disrupting the class. Late assignments will be marked down 5% after the first day and 1% every day afterwards. No coursework will be accepted after the last day of class.

Weekly Schedule

Week 1

Class 1.1 Lesson 1

Grammar: direct and indirect pronouns, *troppo* vs. *tanto*, past tense and imperfect + modal verbs, *ci* (*andarci, tenerci, provarci*).

Vocabulary: studying Italian in Italy, discuss the importance of learning a second language, ask information about a language course

Class 1.2 Lesson 2

Grammar: *stare* + gerund vs. *stare per*, prepositions of time, conjunctions.

Vocabulary: talk about past events, express feelings and describe someone's personality.

Assignment due: understand and talk about the news

Class 1.3 Lesson 3

Grammar: conditional present, future vs. conditional, future.

Vocabulary: talk about holidays

Class 1.4 Lesson 4

Grammar: pronouns with *ne*, *ne* vs. *ci*, adjective *bello*, conjunctions (*anzi*, *invece di*).

Vocabulary: express agreement and disagreement, talk about hobbies,
